

## General Information

## GREAT RESPONSIBILITIES

**Badges**: You must wear your badge so it is visible at all times. Your badge is your ticket into all of our events and functions. Anyone seen without a badge in any of our function rooms will be asked to leave.

If you find someone's badge., or lose your own badge, please contact registration or convention operations. Lost badges may require the purchase of a new membership.

**Conduct**: Conventions are for having a good time and meeting old and new friends. We want everyone at FenCon to have a great time, but we will not tolerate dangerous, illegal, or threatening behavior. FenCon reserves the right to revoke the membership and badge of any person or persons whose behavior is deemed to be detrimental to the convention as a whole. Refunds for revoked memberships are at the sole discretion of the FenCon Chairperson.

**Hotel**: Please be courteous to all guests of the hotel. We are not the only people at the hotel this weekend. So let's all get along and have a great time. Please observe all rules posted by the hotel in various locations.

**Smoking**: Smoking is prohibited in all convention rooms and public areas, including hallways and the Hospitality Suite. This includes the patio outside the hospitality suite. Please obey the hotel's posted smoking policies.

**Alcohol**: The legal drinking age in Texas is 21 years old. Any minors found in possession of alcohol and any adults found to be providing alcohol to minors will have their memberships revoked and be removed from the convention. No exceptions.

Please drink responsibly. If you have had too much, please get a room at the hotel, call a cab, or ask a sober friend for a ride. We want to see you all on Sunday...and at FenCon V next year!

**Food**: No food or drink is allowed in any convention space except the Hospitality Suite.

**Weapons:** We know. Weapons policies are no fun. But, we don't want to have the convention shut down by the hotel or police, so we have to have one. Apart from the costume contest, no one is allowed to carry any weapon that would be considered illegal in Texas. A pocket knife is fine. A dagger is not. A *sgian dubh* is fine. A claymore is not. (Please use common sense.) Any swords, knives, or other weapons purchased in the Dealer's Room must be wrapped before leaving the room and taken immediately to your hotel room, car or other safe place.

**Autographs**: Most of our guests are willing to give you their autograph, but please follow these simple rules: When possible, only request autographs during the designated autograph sessions. If there is a line, please limit yourself to 3 items to be autographed per guest. Please do not ask any guest for an autograph as they are leaving or going to a panel, or while they are at lunch or dinner.

**Photographs**: FenCon does not want to restrict your right to take photos. But please respect the wishes of your intended subjects. If someone asks that you not take their picture, please respect their wishes. Please do not block traffic to take someone's photo. Move to a less populated area.

**Recording**: Recording of performances and programming at FenCon is allowed only for the private use of the person making the recording. If a panelist or performer requests that there be no video or audio taping, please respect his or her wishes.

**5-2-1:** Ah, the old convention cliché. Not only for your own enjoyment of the convention, but also for the enjoyment of your fellow fans, please remember the 5-2-1 rule of conventions. At least 5 hours of sleep a night, at least 2 meals a day, at least 1 shower a day. Thank you.

**Fun**: Everyone attending FenCon is required to have fun. Anyone being gloomy or not enjoying the convention will be chastised and pointed at.

"I didn't appreciate the rain," she says, real stuck-up. "It almost ruined my outfit," and flies off.

Man, I am really confused now because I never bomb with chicks, and here I've struck out twice. "What's going on around here?" I say.

"Chaos theory," somebody says, and I see it's a spider, crawling around on the rose leaves.

But chicks are a lot like humans everything is always somebody else's fault.

So I am sitting there, thinking this chaos theory is about as good an idea as the butterfly net, when up comes Buzz. "Hey, wanna drag?" he says.

I don't answer him.

"Wanna go pick up chicks?" he says, looking at the chick who flew by before and who has landed on a peony now and is sitting there looking real cute.


